Presentations: The presentations are original works, based on the results of empirical or documentary investigations, presented by one or more authors. Selection will be based on submission of an <u>abstract</u>, 250 to 300 words long and including three to five keywords; it must also contain the title of the work and the institutional affiliation of the author(s).

Symposia: The symposia are parallel sessions in which participants will present their presentations. Each symposium will have a coordinator appointed by the Congress Organising Committee, or by groups of authors who can propose a symposium with at least 4 presentations, and will be open to receive other works proposed by the organisation.

The time allowed for presentation of the works shall be between 15 and 20 minutes, depending on the number of works to be presented.

Posters: The posters will be shown for the three days of the congress in the Isla Teja Campus of Universidad Austral de Chile. The posters accepted must be handed in to the Secretariat of the congress organisation by the author(s) in printed format.

The posters must have dimensions of between 700 mm and 1000 mm; they may be hung vertically or horizontally. They must include a title and an abstract of 250 to 300 words, with three to five keywords. The recommended length is no more than 1000 words including the abstract. The visual composition of the work is very important (including photographs, drawings and graphics).

The posters will be shown on permanent panels, with specific times allocated for oral presentation in the Congress venue. The showing times





for the posters within the final programme of the Congress will be announced in good time.

Submission of proposals

Proposals for presentations, symposia and posters must be submitted using the following link:

All the proposals must be submitted in the form of an abstract indicating: title, author(s), institutional affiliation, e-mail and thematic line (see list below). Proposals for symposia must include at least 4 presentations, with their respective abstracts and author details. The lengths of the abstracts will be 250 to 300 words for presentations; 400 to 500 words for symposia (plus the abstract for each presentation included); 250 to 300 words for posters.

Thematic Lines

Territorial governance of SYAL, actors, local networks and institutions

This thematic line includes, among other possible sub-lines, the following: Public policies and governance of SYAL; Interculturality in food supply and in localised agri-food systems; Women, gender and localised agri-food systems; Indigenous peoples, ethnicity and food supply.

Climate change, biodiversity, environment and agro-ecology

This thematic line includes, among other possible sub-lines, the following: Biodiversity and genetic resources as bio-cultural heritage; Adaptation to climate change in localised agri-food systems; Agri-ecological and transition practices; Recycling sub-products in localised agri-food systems for generation of bio-consumables, bio-products and bio-energy; Blue bio-economy and localised marine food systems;

Economy of Localised Agri-Food Systems

This thematic line includes, among other possible sub-lines, the following: Local markets, fairs, economies of proximity and short circuits; Certification processes for food products (denominations of origin, quality seals, participative guarantee systems and other forms of certification); Consumption dynamics and the role of consumers in strengthening SYAL.

<u>Foodstuff recycling strategies in products, processes and systems</u>

This thematic line includes, among other possible sub-lines, the following: Agrotourism and localised agri-food systems; Innovation and territorial identity of foods; Identification and characterisation of local foods and handicrafts; Recycling and innovation policies for SYAL products; Forests





and forest food products; Agri-food festivals; The role of ICT in recycling local products.

Social movements and localised agri-food systems

This thematic line includes, among other possible sub-lines, the following: Collective action in localised agri-food systems; Human right to water in SYAL; Loss of legal status of the traditional quality of foodstuffs; Privatisation, contamination with genetically modified organisms and defence of traditional seeds.
